What changes to menstrual bleeding patterns may occur?	There can be increased bleeding and spotting days in the first six months of use. Within three years, most people have fewer than four bleeding or spotting days per month. There are slightly fewer bleeding and spotting days per month with Mirena compared to Kyleena.		Volume, pain and length of periods can all increase, especially initially.
How many people's periods stop altogether?	12.3% after 1 year. 23% after 5 years.	18.6% after 1 year. 30-40% after 5 years.	None.
Will the IUD help reduce period pain?	Reduces pain associated with periods.	Reduces pain associated with periods and pain associated with endometriosis and adenomyosis.	No.
What are the hormonal side effects?	 Side effects with both may include headache, breast tenderness, acne, mood changes and irregular bleeding. If these occur most will resolve with continued use of the IUDs. There isn't enough evidence yet to show whether Kyleena is associated with fewer hormonal side effects. 		Nil.
Can I use it after I've had a baby?	 All IUDs can be inserted from four weeks after you've given birth. All IUDs are safe to use if you are breastfeeding.
